

#### **Homework Policy**



It is expected that you attend ALL classes and complete ALL work assigned, including formative assessments. However, in the event that you cannot attend a class here's what has to happen:

1. You will contact me via Remind to let me know AND a note or phone call from a parent/guardian must be brought in/phoned in with a reasonable excuse for the absence. (Sickness, medical appointments, family emergencies, funerals are all reasonable excuses. Getting hair/nails done,

shopping, taking a driver/learners test, hunting are not reasonable excuses).

- 2. Missed assessments must be completed in a reasonable amount of time. Report periods are used for cut off. This helps everyone stay on track and not feel overwhelmed at the end of the course.
- 3. GAIN is the period immediately following this class. I expect that you will attend GAIN to catch up on any missing work. Most days I can support you during GAIN if need be.

#### **Teaching Strategies:**

In ELA class, there will be an opportunity for the students to engage in a variety of learning activities. This will attempt to create a balance between teacher-directed & student-directed learning, as well as individual & cooperative activities. These will include, but are not limited to:

- · Individual Activities: notes, questions, brainstorming, sketching/cartooning, vocabulary, etc.
- · Small group Activities: pair & shares, brainstorming, summary posters, tic-tac-toe etc.
- Large group activities: discussion, jig-saw groups, article/video analysis, guided reading, etc.

Many of the learning activities in class will attempt to actively engage the students in their own learning, and activities that will emphasize critical thinking and effective communication. Meaningful discussion and total participation techniques will often be used to practice these skills. The teacher's role is that of facilitator, offering up mini-lessons that use both print & visual resources, to explore concepts that students will then interact with individually or collaboratively (within a group).

#### Assessments:

I use both formative and summative assessments in my class. Formative assessments are those which students practice in preparation for the summative assessment. While formative assessments are not "for marks", this is where the majority of your feedback will take place and an opportunity to master the outcomes expected risk free. It is essential that you do formative practice in order to improve your skills and be at the top of your game for summative assessments. I do take into consideration your formative assessments when making a final decision on any grade.

#### **PowerSchool**

This portal is used as a tool for teachers to communicate with students and parents about such things as attendance, marks, discipline, schedules, assignments, events, fees and graduation requirements.

### **Updates:**

- -Marks on PowerSchool will be updated as things are handed in and marked (regularly, usually every 2-3 weeks).
- Assignment marks will be updated before the end of unit & summative exam. Except if you have handed in late assignments, these may not be up-to-date.
- -Further, a more thorough update will be made when marks are due to be submitted for the report card.
- -Students are encouraged to access the PowerSchool for themselves. You can download an app on your phone, or check your chromebook.


#### Remind
